- 12 Week Program- 3 Days per week
- Career Readiness Training: Resume Building, Mock Interviews, Job Skills
- Peace Circles and Restorative Justice
- Violence Prevention Training
- Certifications: Six Sigma White Belt, Employment 101, Advanced Certifications
- Participants Receive stipends = Earn up to \$1200 for participation
- Transportation Assistance (Bus Cards)
- Gun Buy Back Events
- Counseling and Mentorship
- Leadership Training
- Job Placement Assistance
