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Quarterly Updates

Committee Update

The Apprenticeship Illinois Committee of the Illinois Workforce Innovation Board continues to focus on its charges by providing guidance on apprenticeship policy throughout the state and encouraging apprenticeships in new locations and sectors. The committee is revising its charges and work plan to include more diversity, equity, inclusion, and access. The Apprenticeship Illinois Committee has formed a group charged with creating the committee's new work plan. This group has met once and will continue to meet until the committee establishes and confirms the work plan.

The committee has started preparation for National Apprenticeship Week. The marketing workgroup leads this charge. National Apprenticeship Week is a celebration held in November annually. The entire committee, including its workgroups, prepares for the celebratory week starting in April.

Marketing Workgroup Update

The marketing workgroup continues to lead the preparation efforts for National Apprenticeship Week (NAW). The group has started working on the proclamation, webinar schedule, NAW timeline, and other NAW efforts.

The group continues to look for content to make short videos. The group is also looking for new members. As of May 18th, 2023, the social media statistics are as follows: **Facebook-300 Followers**, **Twitter- 45 Followers**, **Instagram-65 Followers**, and **LinkedIn-1057 Followers**.

Pre-Apprenticeship Workgroup Update

This group has been working on a "Barriers and Next Steps for Expansion of Pre-Apprenticeship" document. They have identified five barriers to expansion and recommended the next steps for each barrier. The group's chair, Manny Rodriguez, will present the finished document to the Apprenticeship Illinois Committee at the next meeting.
