Career Pathways for Targeted Populations Committee (CPTP) Committee Charter January 2024

Charge:

- Charge 1: Create opportunities for job seekers within specified targeted populations of all ages and abilities, understanding that creating equitable access to career pathways for target populations creates a more robust workforce system. Our goal is to enhance career awareness, career skills, career retention, and life skills through experiences with education and training, work-based learning, and essential skills leading to in-demand, high-wage occupations for target populations.
- Charge 2: Serves as the intersection between job seekers, businesses, the education system, local workforce agencies, community-based organizations, and other interested stakeholders.

Priorities:

- Continuous Improvement: Linking the IWIB and the Local Workforce system to impact and improve the lives of Illinois citizens particularly those that are identified as WIOA-targeted populations, recognizing the equity implications of this work.
- Service Integration: Integration and comprehensive involvement of all partners, including the four core partners, business sector, secondary and postsecondary education, workforce labor, legislative, and local implementation partners. There is a need for a holistic approach for target populations.
- Collaboration: Act as a resource regarding career pathways for target populations across the state, and in partnership with the committees and task forces of the IWIB. Participate in grant Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFO) as relevant.



 Support Career Pathway Development for Target Populations: Our three workgroups, the Justice-Impacted Employment Workgroup, Disability Workgroup, and Opportunity Youth Workgroup work to advance career pathway opportunities for target populations.

Priorities:

- **Service integration:** Highlight opportunities for funding, that increase collaboration among agencies, the business sector, and the education system.
- Career pathway awareness: Align focus and priorities around career pathways that result in high skill, high wage, in-demand occupations for persons who are justice-impacted. Highlight best practices, such as Fair Chance employment, and increase knowledge of career pathways.
- Continuous improvement: Improve access and delivery for all persons who are justice-impacted. Enhance efficient communication among stakeholders.

Workgroup Timeline: The group plans to meet throughout 2024, with an emphasis on creating resources for employers looking to hire individuals with disabilities. The CPTP reviews the work of each workgroup annually and aligns workgroups with target population needs.

2023 CPTP Annual Report

Promote Leading Career Pathway Models and Best Practices

The CPTP met quarterly in September 2022, December 2022, March 2023, and June 2023. Each meeting focused on a target population, highlighting best practices and models for career pathways for that target population.

- September 2022: Focus on career pathways for Justice-Impacted Individuals, held at Black Hawk Community College. The meeting involved hearing from Justice-Impacted individuals who have found job opportunities and a post-meeting tour of the Kewanee Lifeskills Re-entry Center.
- December 2022: Annual Review Meeting of the work of the CPTP
- March 2023: Focus on Opportunity Youth hosted youth to speak on their experience at an Area Career Center and featured a presentation by the Bloomington Area Career Center and local Community Organizations.
 Following the meeting, there was an opportunity to tour the Bloomington Area Career Center.
- June 2023: Focus on Individuals with Disabilities: in partnership with the State Rehabilitation Council, the group met in Collinsville, Illinois, to discuss apprenticeships for individuals with disabilities in the Collinsville region. The meeting included opportunities for a tour at Holly's House of Hope before the meeting and a networking opportunity at Soulcial Kitchen following the meeting.

Promote Innovative Career Pathway Solutions

The three workgroups of the CPTP (Disability, Justice-Impacted Employment, and Opportunity Youth Workgroups) each work to promote innovative career pathway solutions for their respective targeted populations.

Disability Workgroup

The workgroup hosted a webinar on October 12, 2022, in honor of Disability Employment Awareness Month, "Tips & Tools for Community-Based Organizations for Supporting Employers in Hiring Individuals with Disabilities." Panelists included:

Justice-Impacted Employment Workgroup

The Justice-Impacted Employment Workgroup met for the first time on August 1, 2022. They added multiple members with lived experience and focused on learning about human-centered design. They changed the workgroup's name from Returning Citizens Workgroup to Justice-Impacted Employment Workgroup. They also concentrate on Service Integration by Collaborating with other Reentry-focused groups throughout the State, including receiving updates on the PROWD grant, the Untapped Talent Series, and the Re-entry Council to establish a workplan.

Opportunity Youth Workgroup

In 2023, the Opportunity Youth Workgroup began by determining barriers youth experience when entering or sustaining a career pathway after hearing from representatives from In-School and Out-of-School Youth Providers. Career awareness and transportation were the top barriers the group decided to focus on this year.

The group then hosted representatives from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the Illinois Community College Board, and the Illinois Department of Employment Services to give an overview of state-funded and sponsored programs to promote career awareness. Finally, the group hosted representatives from Will County and the Illinois Manufacturers Association to discuss their career awareness programs and services. The group is working to compile these resources into an Opportunity Youth Resource Repository on IL Workforce Academy to share with interested stakeholders.
